♦ Welcome for students enrolled at Le Mans Université

Le Mans Université has set up a Bureau d'Accueil International (International Welcome Center, BAI) which welcomes international students on their arrival, whether they are exchange students or free movers. The BAI offers support for the duration of your stay, helping with administrative procedures and answering any questions you may have.

Finding somewhere to live is not always easy.

Rents are often high, and landlords require financial quarantees (such as a deposit).

Nevertheless, there is a wide range of accommodation on offer: halls of residence that are exclusively reserved for students and managed by the CROUS, student halls and private lodgings, rooms in private homes, flatshares...

The main thing is to start preparing for this as early as possible, before leaving your home country.

Travelling to Le Mans from Paris:

- if you arrive at Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport, take a direct train for Le Mans (journey time by TGV: 1 hour 30).
- if you arrive at Paris-Orly airport, take the shuttle service to Gare Montparnasse then take the train to Le Mans (1 hour by TGV). - if you are coming from central Paris, take the train from Gare Montparnasse:

On your arrival, to get from Le Mans station to the University, take the tramway from the station (direction Université) and get off at the Campus-Ribay stop.

The CROUS (Centre Régional des Œuvres Universitaires et Scolaires - Regional Centre of University and

School Services) has branches in all major French university towns.

It manages university halls of residence and canteens, allows you to meet social workers, and offers cultural activities and job opportunities.



ENROLLMENT IN YOUR INSTITUTION

◆ CVEC

Before you can enroll in your institution, you must download proof of payment of the Contribution Vie Etudiante et de Campus (CVEC) – the student and campus life contribution fee.

◆ Confirm Registration

Take note! Even if you have a pre-registration letter,

you are not officially enrolled. You must confirm your enrollment with the institution's Service de la Scolarité (Admissions) as soon as you arrive.

RESIDENCE PERMITS

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- If you have just arrived in France on a longterm VLS-TS student visa: you must validate it online as soon as you arrive in France, on the ANEF (Administration numérique pour les Etrangers en France - Digital Administration for Foreigners in France) website. This validation must be carried out within the three months following your arrival: https://administration-etrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/
- If you have Algerian citizenship or you are a student holding a "concours" visa or a visa bearing the mention "carte à solliciter dans les deux mois" ("card to be requested within two months"): your request for a residence permit must be carried out at the Préfecture.
- If you hold a "mineur scolarisé" ("minor in education") visa and you have since attained your majority, you must request a residence permit directly on the ANEF website or at the préfecture of your place of residence within the two months following your attaining the age of legal majority: https://administrationetrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/particuliers/#/

Please note: if you wish to renew your residence permit or VLS-TS, you must make your request during the third month preceding the date of end of validity of your current residence permit, on the following website: https://administration-etrangers-en-france.interieur.gouv.fr/ particuliers/#/

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

If you stay in France for more than 3 months, it will be much easier day-to-day if you open a bank account, **online or in one of the bank agencies located in Le Mans** (a lot of them are situated Place de la République).

ACCESSING HEALTHCARE

Accessing healthcare in France is almost free, but you must be insured. You must therefore be registered with the national health insurance programme

As a student, you can also take advantage of the university medical services. In these health centers where consultations are free, you'll be greeted by a team of doctors and nurses who can give personalized advice in terms of health and prevention.

TAKING OUT COMPLEMENTARY HEALTH INSURANCE ("MUTUELLE")

We recommend you take out complementary health insurance in order to cover the totality of your healthcare costs, which are not all covered by the compulsory and free national health insurance programme.

Please note: options and levels of insurance vary from one insurer to another. In order to choose the complementary insurance that is best adapted to your situation and your budget, you can access more information on a student "mutuelles" price comparison website.

HOUSING INSURANCE

In France, housing insurance is mandatory. You can sign up for housing insurance called "garantie risques locatifs" - rental risk guarantee - at your bank or a private insurance company. Online subscription is often possible.

EMERGENCY NUMBERS

SAMU: Call 15 Emergency Medical Services

Police emergency: Call 17 in the event of violence, theft, robbery.

Fire Department: Call 18 in the event of fire, gas leak, water damage, natural catastrophe, or traffic accident.

Call 112: European emergency services number that's accessible from anywhere in the European Union in addition to the Erench numbers above.

LEARNING FRENCH

Learning French is an opportunity that's not to be missed!

FINDING A JOB OR AN INTERNSHIP

It is important that you have sufficient financial resources to come and study in France.

Working in France as a foreign student is possible within limits, namely for a maximum duration of 964 hours per year. This can therefore only be a way of earning supplementary funds.

Please note: to work in France, if you are not a citizen of the European Union, you must hold a valid **student residence permit.**

To help you find a job or work experience placement, 3 addresses:

CULTURE AND NIGHTLIFE

Movie theaters, concerts, theaters, operas, museums, exhibitions, and festivals are on the program and most of the time, at reduced cost for students: http://www.lemans.fr > Le Mans dynamique > Les loisirs.

At Le Mans Université, the Service Culture (Culture Office) offers a number of structured activities and runs the EVE-Scène Universitaire auditorium, where a program of events - theater, dance, concerts, movies and conferences - is organized throughout the year: http://www.univ-lemans.fr > Campus & moi > Ca bouge > Culture.

The Culture Office also offers cultural excursions, via the **Pass Parcours** which entitles students to 3 shows for €10 at various venues in Le Mans.

For entertainment or to pick up some culture, you can choose from:

- 3 multiplex cinemas, with several theaters (student rates, rewards card) including an arthouse theater, the Cinéastes.
- 4 major municipal museums including a scientific institution **Musée Vert**, Le Mans's natural history museum: http://www.lemans.fr > Le Mans dynamique > Des idées de visite > Les musées (and then musée Vert).

Admission to museums in Le Mans is free of charge for students aged under 26.

- Some 15 theater and concert venues, including Les Quinconces-L'Espal, the new auditorium and nationally recognized theater which offers drama, movies, music, opera, dance and visual arts: https://www.guinconces-espal.com/
- Some dozen bookshops, including Librairie Doucet, Librairie Thuard and Librairie Bulle, specializing in graphic novels and comics.
- A network of 6 multimedia libraries (free membership for students aged under 25): https://mediatheques.lemans.fr

Le Mans was awarded the label Pays d'Art et d'Histoire (Art and History Region) in 2002.

- Cité Plantagenêt (the historic center of Le Mans) and its 20 hectares of cobbled streets, traditional houses and Renaissance hotels, sheltered by a Roman wall and overlooked by a towering cathedral.
- Roman walls, the best-preserved walls dating back to the Roman Empire.
- Cathédrale St-Julien, one of the largest in France, with one of the world's finest collections of medieval stained glass.
- Grande-Rue which runs through the old town, with its traditional houses
- Place des Jacobins, the large square alongside the cathedral.
- Place St-Michel, including the home of 17th century French writer Paul Scarron.
- The giant hourglass, a contemporary sculpture consisting of an immense cube of metal and glass, in the Jardin de Tessé.
- The Musée de Tessé, with its surprising Egyptian Gallery.
- Le Musée des 24 heures du Mans, offering an insight into the world-famous motor race, with around 100 vehicles, including a number that triumphed on the famous circuit.
- The Jardin des Plantes is a 5-hectare botanic garden created in 1870, within easy reach of the town center.
- Le Mans river port, a relaxing spot for a variety of activities.

APRIL

• Europa Jazz Festival, a major international jazz festival, with concerts in various venues.

MAY

• European Museum Night offers an opportunity to discover museums and other cultural sites in a new light!

JUNE

- Fête de la Musique: Music everywhere in town (free concerts).
- The 24-hour Le Mans international motor race: an exceptional circuit, the longest in the world (over 8 miles), with cars speeding round at over 350 kilometers per hour.

JULY - AUGUST

- Les Soirs d'été, a multidisciplinary festival (theater, dance, music, circus, film) featuring free shows at outdoor venues all over town.
- The Nuit des Chimères illuminates the historic town center Cité Plantagenêt every evening.

SEPTEMBER

- Campus en Fête, free event: concerts, sporting challenges, food-tasting...
- Les Journées Européennes du Patrimoine (European Heritage Days), free visits of cultural venues.
- Sport en Fête, organized by the city of Le Mans, over 150 associations present 50 sports disciplines.
- Tour of the town for new "Manceaux", the town council gives new students a tour of Le Mans to help them get to know their new home.
- La Foire du Mans, large-scale local fair, 100,000 visitors, 550 exhibitors (free entry on certain days).
- Entre Cours et Jardins, celebration of plants and gardening in Le Mans's old town.

OCTOBER

- Science Festival in the University laboratories and the Science Village at the Abbaye Royale de l'Épau in Le Mans.
- The 25° heure du Livre, one of France's largest book fairs (reduced student rate).

NOVEMBER

• Festival Bebop, an important festival for discovering new trends in French music.
